DRIVER EDUCATION

All Wisconsin teens under age 18 must complete 30 hours of a driver education class (live or online), and they must complete behind-the-wheel education with a certified instructor consisting of 6 hours of driving and 6 hours of observing another student driving.

30 Hour Live Class - Offered Multiple Times a Year (Currently on Hold)

Classroom consists of 30 hours of instruction as required by the State of Wisconsin. The program is designed to help novice drivers develop the knowledge, skills, and attitudes necessary to become safe, low-risk, responsible drivers. The cost of classroom instruction is \$120

30 Hour Online Course - Students Can Take at Their Convenience

We are partnering with Teach Safe to offer this online course. It consists of 30 hours of online coursework that fulfills the state driver education classroom requirement. Students can start at any time and work at their own pace for up to 2 hours per day. The cost of this course is \$99 and can be started by going to willieswheels.com.

Driver Education - Behind-the-Wheel - Offered Entire Year

Behind-the-Wheel (B-T-W) training consists of 6 hours of driving and 6 hours of observation (observing another student driving) as required by the State of Wisconsin. The lessons are scheduled with each student individually. The student will learn the concepts and maneuvers necessary to develop the knowledge and the physical skills of driving. The cost of Behind-the-Wheel instruction is \$55 per drive (\$330 for all 6 drives). Drives can be paid for in full or \$55 can be paid at the start of each drive.

Instruction Permit (Temps)

To get an instruction permit at the DMV, the student:

- Must be at least 15 years old
- Must have an application signed by an instructor stating they are enrolled in B-T-W if under 18
- Must have a certified copy of their birth certificate or a passport and social security card
- Must pass the DMV temps test (study Wisconsin Motorists' Handbook at wisconsindmy.gov/handbooks)
- Does NOT have to be finished with classroom if classroom is done through Willie's Wheels.

Probationary License

Once a student is 16 years old, has held an instruction permit for 6 months, has completed classroom instruction and B-T-W, and has gotten the appropriate practice driving with an adult, the student is eligible to take the road test of their Wisconsin Probationary Driver's License.

Cost to use the Driver Education car for the DMV road test: \$55
